

Q: You have over fifteen years of philanthropy leadership experience, with the bulk of your work in healthcare and education. What inspired your move to senior services?

A: I've seen firsthand the difference a compassionate, caring environment can make in an older adult's life. After my grandfather passed away, my family was very concerned about my grandmother becoming withdrawn and lonely. We know that social isolation can quickly lead to mental and physical decline, especially in our senior population.

When my grandmother made the move to an assisted living facility, she flourished. It was truly a second act for her. Her apartment was down the hall from the Executive Director's office, so she was always in the thick of things. She made so many friends and even became the community's designated flower arranger, touching up the bouquet deliveries and deciding where they should be displayed. My family often joked that she was like the mayor of her community.

My goal at United Methodist Communities is to apply my years of experience to advance our mission of abundant life for seniors. I want all our residents to enjoy the same type of positive experience my grandmother had in her later years.

Q: What are you most looking forward to in your new role?

A: I am certainly looking forward to getting to know my colleagues, our residents, and our wonderful UMC Foundation supporters. With the vaccine rollout, I know that better days are ahead. I hope to be able to visit our communities and meet everyone in person very soon!

Creating a Legacy of Care for Seniors



Like many of our Foundation supporters, Adrienne Vacanti learned the importance of giving back to her community at a very young age.

Ter mother, Edith, emigrated to the U.S. in 1952, at the age of 8. Her family had been sponsored by a United Methodist church in New York. The congregation's generosity changed the course of Edith's life and became a driving force behind her desire to help others.

Adrienne's father George dedicated his life to serving his community as a United Methodist pastor. He was in the midst of his ministry at Denville Community Church when United Methodist Communities



at Bristol Glen opened in 2001. George, along with many other Skylands District clergy, lent his support to UMC's mission of caring for older adults.

United Methodist Communities' tradition of caring for seniors who've outlived their financial resources stuck with Adrienne. When she graduated from college and was deciding which causes to support through her own charitable giving, United Methodist Communities was one of the organizations she and her husband Michael chose.

In 2019, Adrienne and her family's relationship with UMC grew deeper. George and Edith were ready to make the move from a 55+ neighborhood to a continuing care retirement community. When they toured United Methodist Communities at Bristol Glen, it immediately felt like home.

Adrienne and Michael feel a deep appreciation for the care her parents receive at Bristol Glen, especially during the unprecedented challenges of COVID-19. Executive Director Jeff Lisk keeps an open line of communication with frequent Family Town Hall meetings via Zoom, and associates help residents navigate technology like Amazon Echos ("Alexas") and iPads to connect with loved ones. UMC's efforts to implement Essential Caregiver visitation guidelines have also made a world of difference.

When asked why her family continues to support the UMC Foundation each year, Adrienne explains, "In the faces of the residents, you can imagine your own relative and the care you'd want for them. My parents are not just taken care of but celebrated for who they are. Older people have so much value, knowledge, and excitement to share, and I am happy to support an organization that recognizes and celebrates that."



he Vacanti family also appreciates the efforts Bristol Glen and the local Leading community is making to keep residents' spirits up. Edith loves singing, and the thought of a Christmas with no choirs, caroling, or the usual festivities was making her feel down. When she went out for a walk in early December, she was thrilled to discover Sussex County's North Star Theater Company singing under the portico. North Star's performance brought a much-needed taste of Christmas cheer and normalcy, and Edith couldn't help but join in!

s a little girl, Colleen Meyers participated in an adopt a grandparent" program with her local Brownies troop. She fondly remembers visiting seniors in local nursing homes and sending letters and cards back and forth. Colleen wanted her own children to have a similar experience, so in 2007 she reached out to United Methodist Communities at Pitman about putting together some small Christmas gifts as a family project.

The project began with three gift baskets and has grown exponentially over the years. Colleen uses social media to reach out to friends and family who are willing to donate gifts and goodies for UMC at Pitman residents, and all of her children participate in a "basket making

day" to assemble the packages. Some years, the Meyers family's efforts result in over 60 Christmas baskets!

Colleen is proud that this year, despite the COVID-19 pandemic, her family was still able to assemble and deliver 36 Christmas baskets.

She shared, "I was very close with my own grandmother. I spent a lot of time with her, and I would've never wanted her to feel lonely. These baskets are something small that we can do as a family to make sure that the seniors at Pitman won't feel alone, especially this year. Even if they don't have any family or friends nearby, they know that someone is thinking of them."
